The Saying	What it Means	Similar Sayings You May Know
He's about as clever as a coil tree and twice as dangerous	Commentary about someone being so stupid they're actually dangerous	He's dumber than a sack of rocks.
She's all drugged up with no cure in sight	Commentary about working toward a goal without ever seeming to reach it.	She's taking two steps forward and one back.
He's as busy as a healer in a new village.	Indicates that someone is too busy to rest or eat	She's busy as a bee.
It's about as exciting as a patient on sleep-vine juice	Indicates that someone or something is boring	It's as bored as can be.
She's as clueless as a new healer-in-training	Indicates naivety	She's clueless.
That's as vile as vomit.	Indicates that something is disgusting	That's gross./That's disgusting.
He wouldn't know a poison from a cure.	An insult about someone's intelligence, usually as it pertains to someone's trade or skill	He couldn't find his own butt with his hands.
Bloody boils!	A curse (sometimes combined with other curses for emphasis)	Crap!
By the Oath!	A curse or exclamation of worry	By all that is holy!
Crusty cysts!	A curse (sometimes combined with other curses for emphasis)	Crap!
Don't count your cures before they work.	A warning not to assume everything will work out in the end just because it seems to be working now	Don't count your chicks before they hatch.
Don't judge the medicine by its taste.	A warning not to make assumptions based on appearances	Don't judge a book by its cover.
Even a brand new healer-in-training gets a diagnosis right sometimes.	An expression to indicate good luck	Everyone gets lucky sometimes.

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It was faster than an infection can set in.	Indicates that something has (or will) happen very quickly	It was quicker than you can say Jack Robinson.
For the love of liniment!	An expression of exasperation or frustration	For Pete's sake!
The venom that doesn't kill you this time may save your life next time.	Indicates that challenges can help you grow	What doesn't kill you makes you stronger.
Oh, go mix some medicine!	An expression of irritation or frustration, usually directed at someone in particular	Get out of my face!/Give me a break!
He can turn a treatment for headaches into a cure for cancer.	Commentary about someone who frequently exaggerates	He tells a good fish story.
You can call a cup of water a cure, but that doesn't make it work.	Commentary about someone who's not being realistic	Get real./Be realistic.
Just as afester syrup is sour...	An exclamation used to emphasize that something is true	Just as dogs bark/As sure as shootin'.
She's not fit to heal a fish.	An insult about someone's lack of ability to help anyone, anytime.	She's useless.
He couldn't cure a headache if he tried.	Indicates a lack of skill	He's useless.
She's as busy as a healer during flu season.	Indicates that someone is very busy	She's as busy as a bee.
He's one dose shy of a cure.	An insult to indicate that someone isn't thinking clearly or is not very intelligent	He's got a screw loose./He's one card shy of a deck.
Poisons and pestilence!	A curse	Crap!
She acts like she'll be the one to cure cancer.	An insult about someone who is overly confident	She thinks she's all that.
I slept like a patient on sleep-vine juice.	Indicates that the person got a good night's sleep	I slept like a log.
It's as painless as a coil-tree burrow.	A reassurance that something won't hurt	You won't feel a thing.
Weeping wounds and watery eyes!	A curse	Crap!
He's worn out the Traveler's Chair.	Indicates that a healer is well trained and very experienced	He knows what he's talking about.

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You can't tell much about the quality of a new cure until you try it out.	A reminder not to make assumptions	First impressions aren't always accurate.
Even the best treatments have side effects.	Indicates that life has its ups and down	Life's a rollercoaster.
Worrying too much quickly turns a little cough into pneumonia.	A reminder that worrying doesn't do you any good	Don't sweat the small stuff.
You can't judge a healer by the size of her medicine bag.	A reminder that appearances don't mean much	You can't judge a book by its cover.
You can't barter for your prized possessions and keep them, too.	A reminder that people usually have to choose between two things they want no matter how much they may want both	You can't have your cake and eat it too.
